Five interlinking pillars, each designed to be 'socially valid':

Structure

Positive Approaches, Attitudes and Expectations

Empathy

Low Arousal

Links

The SPELL Framework

SPELL is not just a framework it is a way of organizing help that is:


- Practical and human
- Rooted in empathy and respect

- Provide context and basis for other approaches
- Adaptable across cultures and settings
- A guide that helps us see, listen and respond better

Focus on 'what we can do'

The 5 Principles of The SPELL Framework

- It is ethical
- It is individual
- It is hopeful
- It is respectful
- It is honest

SPELL Audit



• Violation: Ignores or opposes the SPELL principles

 Misunderstanding : Mis-application due to partial understanding of the SPELL principles


Good Practice: Complies with SPELL principles and shows good understanding

SPELL Malaysia


